THINGS TO KNOW

- **Lake Como is a clothing-free facility (it is not clothing-optional). Nudity is expected (conditions permitting) once inside the main resort area (after passing through the gates by the office). We invite you to share the bliss of our little slice of nude heaven.**
 - Burns are known for creative self expression via costumery which is fine in the Burn event area outside the main gate/resort, but once inside the resort gate/grounds, please refrain from Burn costumery (except for the Sat parade) & adhere to Lake Como policies per above.
- Nudity is required in these areas; no exceptions (no bathing suits, shorts, clothing, pasties, etc): Pool & inside pool deck fence, hot tub, & sauna.
- **REMINDER: The “no photography” policy is strictly enforced at Lake Como Resort. Only sanctioned resort photographers may take pictures (& only of those with wrist bands who have signed the photo release form).**
 - Please use cell phones with discretion. We don't want anyone to think you are taking pictures when you are just checking/using your phone.
- A 1st Aid/Lost & Found “Safety Station” Tent will be in the Burn common area near the stage. Find us if you need us!
- Inside the main resort/pool/hot tub/housing areas **quiet hours** should be observed **midnight – 8 a.m.**
- WiFi access: Wi-Fi is not available in the event area (outside of the main resort area). WiFi is available in the Rec Hall (inside the resort – veer left after passing the office). Password posted on the back wall.
- Ice is available for purchase for \$2.25/bag at the office from 8 a.m.-11 p.m. daily; an air-conditioned Rec Hall inside the resort is available for guests to get out of heat or rain (8 a.m.-midnight daily)
- An ATM is available in the office (though no money can be exchanged for any part of the Burn or tribal activities/events themselves).
- Lake Como Resort has an on-site café & bar (available to Burn guests but will require payment):
 - Bare Buns Café Hours: *Fri: 11am-9pm; Sat: 8 am-9pm; Sun: 8 am-8pm, M/W/TH: 11am-8pm*
 - Breakfast buffet Sat & Sun 8 a.m.-noon: \$13.50 + auto gratuity, includes beverage
NOTE: A 20% gratuity will be added to all meal purchases during this event weekend.
 - Butt Hutt Bar: Mon-Fri: 4-9 p.m.; Sat/Sun: 1 - 11 p.m. (*usually stays open a bit longer on wknds)

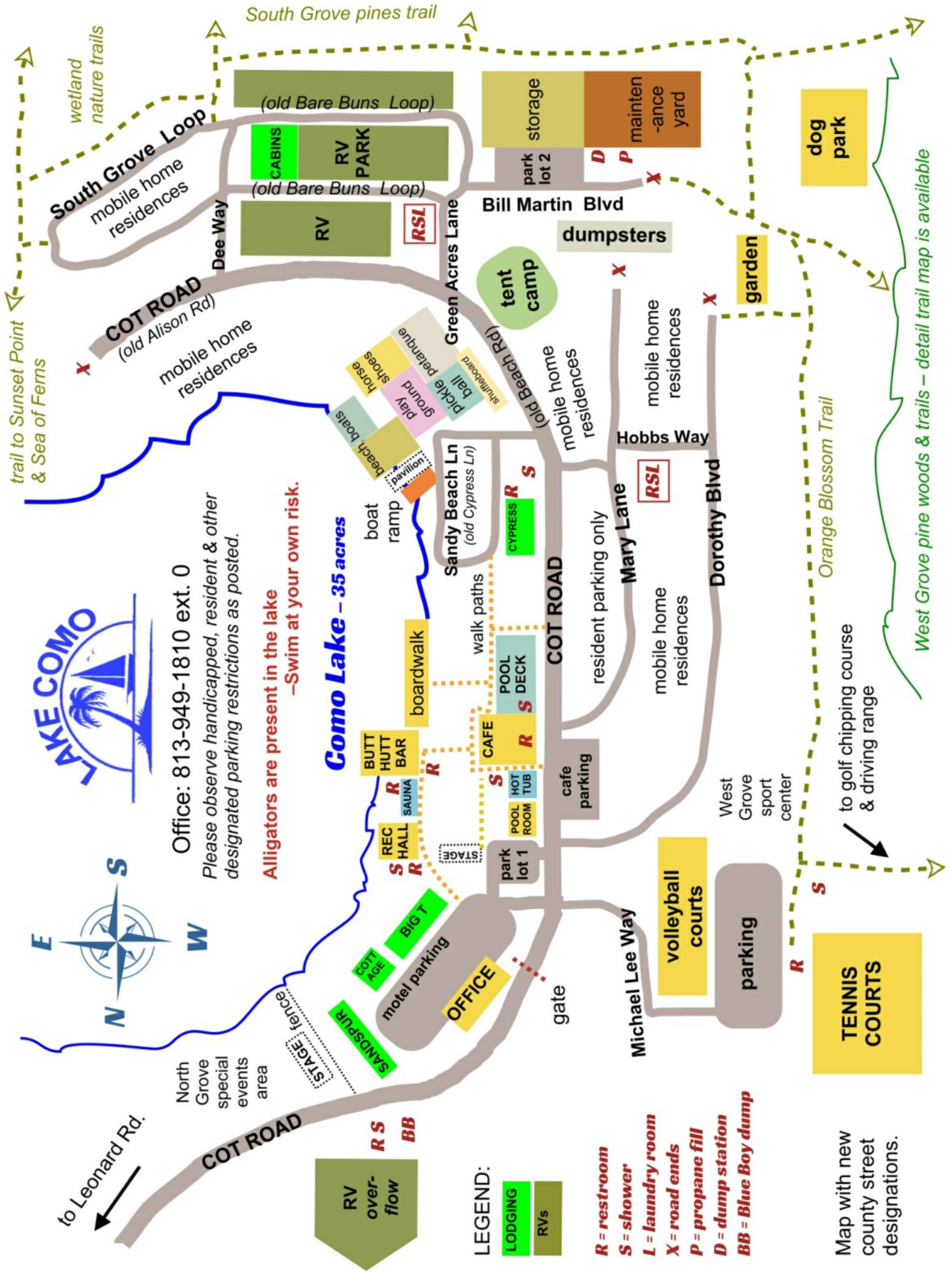


Naked Burn Event Area

For the comfort & convenience of all our members & guests, please observe our basic resort rules.

We are a nudist community: nudity is expected and accepted throughout the resort (weather permitting).

Dress: Residents, members, and guests of the Resort are expected to be nude in the Resort, weather permitting. Towels or seat coverings must be used at all times while sitting in public areas. Underwear, bathing suits, T-backs, thongs, etc., are not permitted. There may be limited circumstances where, due to medical reasons, body covering may be necessary. In those cases, the person should report to the Office for clearance. Provocative clothing may only be worn at special events where such clothing is appropriate, provided that minors are not present.

Prohibited Conduct. Violations of privacy, public intoxication, use of illegal drugs, immoral conduct, and disturbance of the peace are prohibited. Unwanted or undue attention to another person's children, gawking, fondling yourself or another person, or physical violence is unacceptable. Sexual or other harassment of members, residents, children, guests, or visitors will result in eviction from the Resort. Carrying a firearm or other deadly weapon on one's person in the Resort is prohibited.

Children (persons under 18) are admitted only accompanied by parent or legal guardian. Parents, guardians, and guests are responsible for the actions, discipline, and safety of their minor children. Minors must be under the supervision of a parent or the parent's designee after curfew times, which are as follows: 10 p.m. for age 11 and under, 11 p.m. for age 12 through 15, and 12 a.m. for age 16 and 17

Swimming/Boating. There are no lifeguards on duty at the pool or beach. Children age 12 and under must be accompanied by and under the direct supervision of a parent or designated responsible adult at all times. All posted rules must be followed.

Radios: Do not play radios loud enough to disturb others; earphones are preferred.

Glass: No glass containers of any kind are allowed in pool, on pool deck, in hot tub enclosure or at the beach area.

Alcohol is sold in the bar and restaurant. Outside drinks of any kind may not be brought into the bar or restaurant per Florida code. Minors are not allowed in the bar. Please be moderate in your alcohol consumption.

Photography of any kind using any device with a camera is prohibited in public areas without the express permission of Lake Como management and all persons in the photographs. A staff member must accompany authorized photographers.

Boating: Club kayaks and paddle boats may be used by adults, and by children accompanied by an adult. Use is at your own risk. Paddles and floatation devices are available at the beach area.

Fishing is allowed away from swim areas. Florida license required.

Laundry: Coin-operated washers and dryers are located at two bath houses in the RV area on Green Acres Ln. and on Hobbs Way. See map. Soap is available in the office.

Pets: Limited pet friendly rooms are available with a pet surcharge; up to 2 pets are allowed per room. Guests may bring pets but aggressive animals will not be allowed. Pets are not allowed in common recreations areas (bar, cafe, pool deck, etc.) and must on leash (6 foot or less fixed, 16 foot or less retractable), and be under owner's control at all times. There is a fenced dog exercise area in the West Grove.

Smoking & Vaping are prohibited: inside any resort building including screened areas – inside guest rooms and cabins – on the pool deck except in the designated smoking area – on trail fire hazard areas as posted.

Quiet Hours are from 11 pm to 8 am (music & partying) but disturbing or annoying noise (drilling, grinding, pounding, sawing, etc.) is prohibited from 5 pm to 9 am.

Valid driver's license is required to drive within the resort. Speed limit is 10 mph and applies to ALL vehicles including golf carts and bicycles.

Please check in office for hour of **Bare Buns Cafe Restaurant** and the **Butt Hutt bar**, which may vary by season.

Office Business Hours are 8 am to 11 pm daily. Staff will be happy to assist with any issues. The entrance window is staffed 24 hours a day; please show your membership card or day pass for re-entry.

Guests not registered for overnight stay must leave by midnight.

2023 Lake Como Naked Burn Festival Principles

Welcome to the Naked Burn

There are “Burns” throughout the world based on the tenets of the Burning Man Festival, held annually in the Black Rock desert in Nevada. A community of over 70,000 people gather to celebrate the human condition in their own way through their art.

There are traditions that govern the behavior of Burners (those attending the festival). The Naked Burn embraces these traditions and requests attendees to respect them. They shape the ambiance of the event and keep everyone on the same page behavior-wise.

There is no money exchanged. If you would like to share something by gifting it, please do. There are no vendors or advertising. Take a break from the money circuit. Lock up your wallets and enjoy. This is a gifting society. If you receive anything from someone, nothing is expected in return.

Self reliance is key to a successful Burn. Be thoughtful about what you bring with you. You need a place to sleep out of the rain. You need to be able to feed yourself and keep yourself safe. Some camps may offer drinks if you keep your own cup handy as you walk around. Wear a light on your body at night for safety’s sake.

Plan on participating. Many people have spent a lot of thought and effort to make the weekend special. Show your appreciation by participating at Theme camps. Much of the art is interactive, so play with it. Radical self-expression is encouraged. Become your alter ego through costuming. Find a way to participate.

Burns are usually “Leave No Trace” events. Everyone is expected to keep their eyes out for MOOP (Matter Out Of Place). No matter how small the item is, pick it up and take it back to your campsite or deposit it in the garbage. Leave the grounds better than you found it. Last thing to do after breaking camp? MOOP Sweep!

A Burn succeeds through communal effort. You don’t have to be part of a Theme Camp to support a Burn. Volunteers keep the festival functioning. Be one! There are lots of opportunities to lend a hand. Mention your intention to volunteer when buying your ticket. You’ll be contacted in regard to the needs of the organizers.

Try to stay in the “now moment.” Your immediate experience may help overcome barriers that stand in the way of recognizing our inner selves, the reality of others, participation in this society and contact with the natural world. It is the touchstone of a Burn.
